



LONG ISLAND PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS






Even though fewer students are educated in Majority White districts.. LONG ISLAND

Even though more students attend racially diverse districts... LONG ISLAND STUDENTS ATTENDING DIVERSE DISTRICTS (30%-69% white and at least 30% Asian, Hispanic, Black, and Other combined)




