12 years ago.

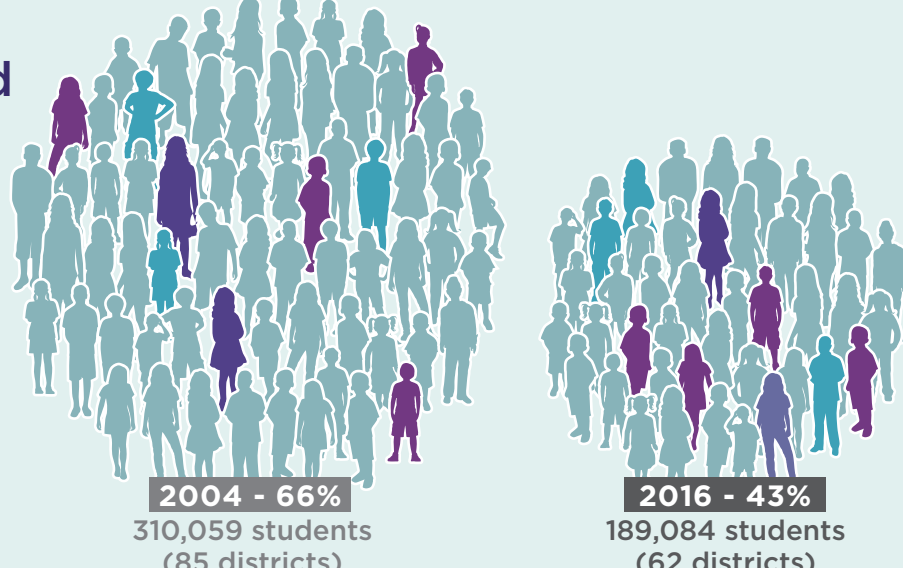
Even though students in Long Island schools
are more diverse overall...

LONG ISLAND PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS
2004 vs 2016:



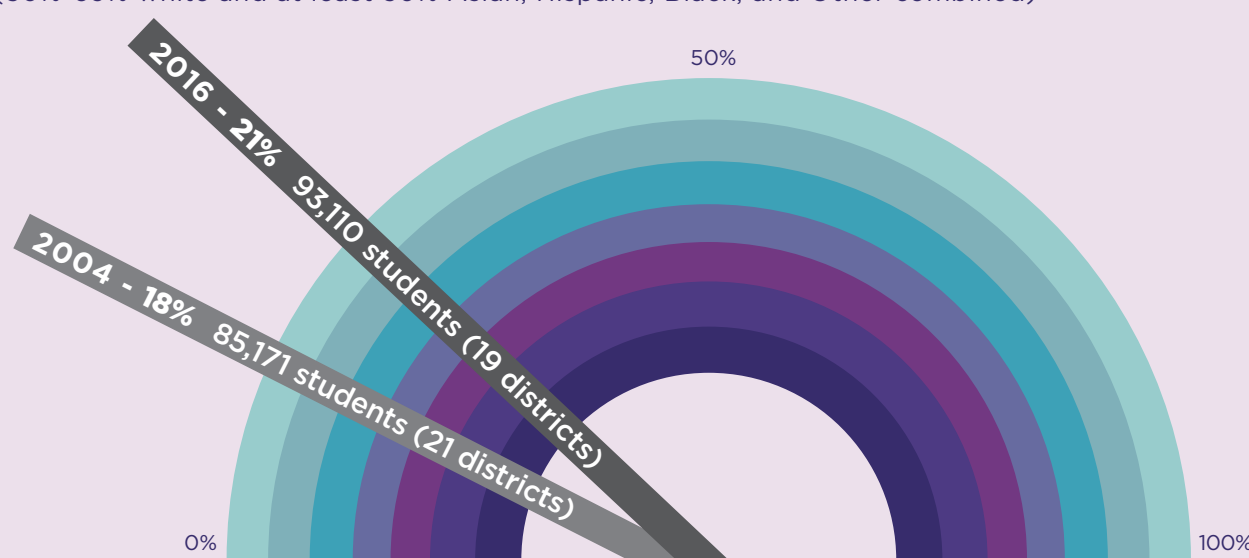
Even though fewer
students are educated
in Majority White
districts...

LONG ISLAND
STUDENTS ATTENDING
MAJORITY WHITE
DISTRICTS
(70-100% white)



Even though more students attend racially diverse districts...

LONG ISLAND STUDENTS ATTENDING DIVERSE DISTRICTS
(30%-69% white and at least 30% Asian, Hispanic, Black, and Other combined)



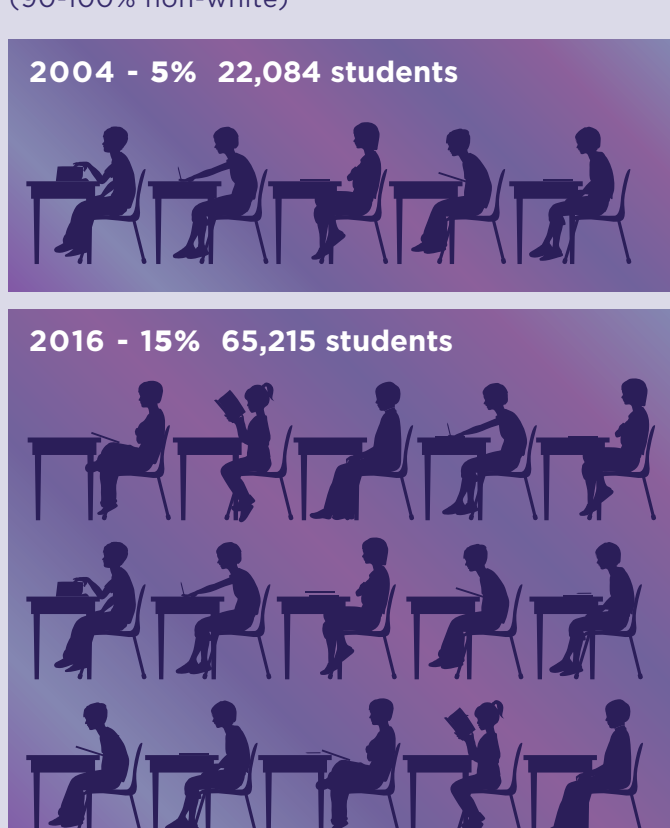
Despite these changes, the fact still remains that
the number of students attending Majority "Minority"
districts has more than **doubled**.

LONG ISLAND STUDENTS ATTENDING
MAJORITY "MINORITY" DISTRICTS
(50-100% non-white)



And for those Majority
"Minority" districts that are
Intensely Segregated,
the number of students
attending has nearly **tripled**.

LONG ISLAND STUDENTS ATTENDING
INTENSELY SEGREGATED DISTRICTS
(90-100% non-white)



Today there are more than
twice as many Intensely
Segregated districts as
there were 12 years ago.

The bottom line?
Shockingly, today, approximately
three out of every four black students

2016: **77%** of all black students attending Majority "Minority" districts
(Up from 60% in 2004)

and **two out of every three Hispanic students**

2016: **65%** of all Hispanic students attending Majority "Minority" districts
(Up from 49% in 2004)

attend a Majority "Minority" segregated school district.

How is this
possible more than
sixty years after
***Brown v. Board of
Education?***

School segregation remains Long Island's
crucial challenge and we must find the
courage to confront it. As a region, we
cannot afford to let this trend continue.
